Race against time movies imdb

What makes a great movie? Why do some stand the test of time while others lose their value slowly (or rather quickly) ? For some films, it's the emotion the story evokes. Sometimes an actor's performance is so memorable, it gets our attention. Every now and then a movie is so visually amazing, it can't be forgotten. I'm gathered a collection of the 30 greatest films of all time. To warn you in advance, this is not the usual list of black-and-white classics and foreign films designed to show off my knowledge of classical cinema. These are the movies we watch because we want to, not because we're told to

- Avatar (2009) Avatar is one of the most beautiful films ever made visually. Even people who complain about special effects in movies dropped their jaws when they saw it for the first time. This film pushed modern cinematic technology into a new era, ushering in an era of stereoscopic tri-mites. Beneath its beauty, the film features a love story between species and a social message. Avatar is a must-see for any movie fan. Best quote: Jake Sully (Sam Worthington) I became a Marine because of the distress. I told myself I could pass any test a person could pass. All I wanted was something worth fighting for.
- Scar face (1983) has a lot of gangster movies out there, but Scar Face is easily the most cited. The story of Cuban immigrant turned mad gangster Tony Montana is rough front to back. The chainsaw scene at first still shakes me. As he gains more power, his greed begins to bring out the best in him. He makes some bad decisions that lead to one of the best death scenes in movie history. Best quote: Tony Montana You need people like me so you can point your fingers and say, this is the bad guy.
- So... What does that make you? Good? You're not good. You just know how to hide, how to lie. Lee, I don't have that problem. Me, I always tell the truth. Even when I'm lying. So say good night to the bad guy!
- The Notebook (2004) In favor of full disclosure, I must admit I have never seen the notebook. The reason I know it's a great movie is because every time I tell a woman I've never seen it, she tries to convince me to watch it. The premise is that a guy falls in love with a girl. They have a budding romance, some kind of conflict gets in the way, and they end up together when they're bigger. This movie is the bar where many women measure a man. Best quote: Noah (Ryan Gosling) says, I'm nothing special; Just a simple man with thoughts from common, and I led a life together. There are no monuments dedicated to me and my name will soon be forgotten. - Audition (1999) I judge horror movies by how many full-length cartoons I have to watch afterwards so I can go to sleep, and an audition is easily a 10 toon movie. Widower auditions women for his new wife. He A beautiful young woman named Asami Yamazaki (Ihi Shayna) ... Which turns out to be the most psychotic film character of all time. Yamazaki has torture scenes so brutal that it's almost unwatchable, and the pleasure she gets in her work goes beyond interrupting. Best quote: Asami Yamazaki: Kiri Kiri Kyri! (Translation: pain pain!)
- Young Frankenstein (1974) Mel Brooks is the king of Borg comedy, and young Frankstein is the scary movie that wants it to be. The actors provide brilliant lines with perfect comic timing. Igor's sercastic responses to Dr. Frankenstein (Gene Wilder) tear me up every time. If you object to older movies, it might change your mind. Best Quote: Igor: Dr. Frankenstein... Frankenstein: Frankenstein. Igor: You put me on. Frankenstein: No, it's pronounced Frankenstein... You must be Igor. Igor: No, it's pronounced 'Ein Gur'.
- The one percent (2006) is the second of Johnson & Johnson heir Jamie Johnson's documentaries documenting a lifestyle that 99% of us will never be. Jamie, who was born rich, gives us all an alert about the lives of some of America's richest families. Jamie's father, Jim, spends most of the film resisting him. With the collapse of the artificial housing market soon after and the Occupy movement popping up 5 years later, it's easy to see what he's afraid of. Best quote: Jamie Johnson: The top 1% of Americans, like my family and I, own roughly 40% of the country's wealth, and we share a cumulative net worth that is greater than the bottom 90% of people combined.
- Cinderella Man (2005) James Braddock (Russell Crowe), a worn-out boxer who fights at impossible odds to compete for the heavyweight championship is one of the most memorable underdogs in cinema. Director Ron Howard expertly recreates the setting of the 1930s to draw you into this sporting drama based on a true story full of award-winning actors. Cinderella Man is all you want in a sports movie. Best quote: James Braddock I have to believe that when things are bad I can change them.
- Bad Kids (1995) Hate about Michael Bay all you want, the man knows how to make an entertaining movie. Bad Boys is a buddy cop movie that never ages, thanks to the personalities of Will Smith and Martin Lawrence. Full of flamboyant car chases and spectacular shots, this is a movie you can sit and watch whenever it's on TV, no matter how far away it is. Best quote: Marcus Burnett (Lawrence) Made me think you were going to shoot me for a minute.
- Mike Laurie (Smith) I was.
- Unforgivable (1992) Before he went crazy and started talking to chairs, Clint Eastwood was responsible for some of the most classic Westerns in American cinema. Unforgivable, he plays Will Mooney, a retired gunman who lets his old friend Ned (Morgan Freeman) persuade him to collect an award from several cows. On the way, they encounter a different influence. And a tough sheriff. It takes a lot for Munny to break down, but once he does, you'll be glad you're watching from afar. Best quote: Will Mooney's fine, I'm coming out. Every person I see out there, I'm going to shoot him. Every son of a bitch shoots me, I'm not only going to kill him, but I'm going to kill his wife, all his friends, and burn down his damn house.
- Leon: The Professional (1994) The story of professional assassin Leon (Luc Besson) is dramatic and touching. He takes in a young girl (Natalie Portman) whose drugged parents are killed by their psychotic dealer (Gary Oldman) and then continues to teach her the tricks of the trade while protecting her and seeking revenge. The pro is one of those movies where you can't help but side with a killer, who deep down has a heart of gold. Best quote: Leon the rifle is the first weapon you learn how to use, because it allows you to keep your distance from the customer. The closer you get to being a professional, the closer you can get to the customer. The knife, for example, is the last thing you learn.
- Love and Basketball (2000) While many romantic movies are difficult for men to watch, love and basketball goes a long way to attracting men into this chick movie genre by incorporating an underlying sports theme. Quincy (Omar Epps) and Monica (Sanaa Lethan) meet on the basketball court as kids, and their love/hate relationship keeps their lives intersecting as they live their personal dreams of playing professional basketball. Best quote: Monica's a trip, you know? When you're a kid, you see the life you want, and it never crosses your mind that it's not going to come out that way.
- The Damaged Locker (2008) War. What's it good for? Great movies. Hurt Locker is a fascinating look at the realities of the Iraq War, and modern warfare in general. It's not a propaganda film. It doesn't take sides. It focuses on decisions faced by soldiers, particularly SFC William James (Jeremy Renner). Hurt Locker is simultaneously a war movie and a technically sound thriller. I don't believe in war, but I believe That Hart Locker is the second best war movie ever made, showing the good and the bad in every soldier. Best quote: SFC James you like to play with it. You like to play with all your stuffed animals. You love your mother... It's your dad. You like your pajamas. You love everything, don't you? Yes. But you know what, buddy? As you get older... Some of the things you love may not seem so special anymore.
- Princess Bride (1987) Fairy tales are a dime a dozen. The princess bride stands at the head and shoulders above all others. It's a naughty children's movie with a lot for adults to love too. It has everything legends need: a mysterious hero (Carrie Alves), a giant (Andre the Giant), a seuf, a princess and a happy ending. The Princess Bride is a reminder of everything that is right about humanity. Best quote: Westley (Alves): If you're in such a hurry, you can take off a rope or tree branch or find You will also have Inigo Montoya (Mandy Patinkin): I can do it. I got rope up here, but I don't think you'd get my help, because I'm just waiting to kill you. It really depresses our relationship.
- Inside a Cop Man (Denzel Washington) tries to talk about a criminal genius (Clive Owen) in the best bank robbery movie ever put on film. What makes the inner man so great is the cat-mouse tension. As the story progresses, you find it's much more than your average bank robbery. It's not just money these guys are looking for, and even knowing they're getting away with it won't take the shock of seeing how... Why... Best quote: Dalton Russell (Owen): This time next week, I'll be sucking a pina colada in a hot tub with six girls named Amber and Tiffany. Keith Frazier (Washington): More like showering with two guys named Jamal and Jesus, if you know what I mean. And here's the bad news? It's not Pina Colada!
- Bill and Ted's Fake Journey (1991)Godfather 2 is often cited in the argument of sequels flocking from the original film, but a fake journey deserves a place on this list. Bill S. Preston, Esk (Alex Winter) and Ted Theodore Logan (Keanu Reeves) were the models of lazy youth long before Beavis and Butthead. Bill and Ted's first film triumphantly explored time travel in a phone booth, but the second film rises the ante, with the foolish couple battling death on a journey through heaven and hell. Beneath Shelock, a fake journey is a light-hearted look at a scary subject. Best quote: Bill and here, our bass player, the Duke of Spock, Doc's shock, the man without a tan, please say hello to death himself, angel of death.
- Mr. and Mrs. Smith (2005) This is the film in which Brad Pitt and Angelina Jolie met. Watching their chemistry on screen, it's easy to see how they lasted so long. No matter how many times this movie is on TV, it's hard not to watch it. Full of gunshots, explosions, comedy, romance, and flat sex appeal, Mr. and Mrs. Smith is a spy movie with something for everyone. It doesn't make you think. It just invites you to sit, stare and smile. Best quote: John Smith (Pete) Your goal is as bad as your cooking favorite... And that means something!
- Love Actually (2003) Love actually follows his stories in three whole of eight British couples engaging in love in very different ways. It's a romantic comedy and a Christmas movie, but it's by no means loose. It's a touching comedy full of amazing moments. You can't watch this movie without laughing, crying, and falling in love with at least one character. Love Actually is the best romantic comedy ever written. Best quote: Billy Mack (Bill Nye) Hey kids. Here's an important message from your Uncle Bill. Don't buy drugs. Be a pop star, and they give them to you for free!
- Good Will Hunting (1997) Server with Access Problem (Matt Damon) Solves a Complicated Math Problem at MIT, Gets A psychiatrist (Robin Williams) has to choose between his street life and being a respected mathematician. Good Will Hunting is a lovely drama with great writing, brilliant acting, and an intelligent story. The film explores a lot of philosophical angles on human experience in a way that draws you in for the best quote: Sean (Williams) So if I asked you about art, you'd probably give me the skinny on every art book ever written. Michelangelo, you know a lot about him. Life's work, political ambitions, him and the Pope, sexual orientations, all jobs, right? - Where the BuffaloEs Roam (1980) While Johnny Depp is often praised for his portrayal of cultural icon Hunter S. Thompson, Bill Murray nailed on the head first. Where Buffalo roamed ashes together some of Thompson's letters about his adventures with his lawyer, Oscar Zeta Acosta. Murray gives a great performance, perfectly captures everything we love about Thompson, and proves he's so much more than just a comedian. Best quote: Hunter in my case, you know, I hate supporting drugs or alcohol, violence, insanity to anyone. But in my case it worked.
- Back to the Future (1985) Back to the Future is a time travel film packed with memorable characters. Biff (Thomas Wilson) is a quintessential bully with some of the best lines on the record in cinematic history. Doc Brown (Christopher Lloyd) inspired a generation of children to become scientists. What makes the movie so great, though, is that the hero Marty McFly (Michael J. Fox) is just a normal kid in a crazy state, and he's getting over it. If he can get over it, anyone can. Best quote: Doc, don't worry. As long as you hit that wire with a hook connecting exactly 140 km per hour, once the lightning hits the tower... Everything's going to be okay.
- Grandma's Child (2006) Grandma's Child is an ensemble comedy that hits all the right notes. The story of the 35-year-old video game test subject forced to live with his grandmother and her golden girl partners, it's literally lol funny throughout. Full of zany characters played by actors usually confined to beat roles, this film is a funny gem in a stack of modern comedies. Everything about Grandma's child is best when watching high, but works equally sober. Best quotes: Jeff (Nick Swardsen) What does 'high score' mean? New High Score... It's bad. What does that mean? Did I break it?
- Walls of Hope (1994) The story of two men who form a friendship during long-term prison sentences, Walls of Hope is the best prison film ever made. Morgan Freeman's voiceover is so good, she launched a second career for him. Andy Dufresne (Tim Robbins) is the kind of hero every movie should be. The dialogue and plot are excellent. The soundtrack is beautiful. Dufresne dances in the rain after crawling through Sewer's is an epic movie moment. You'd be tempted to run out and dance with him. Best quote: Red (Freeman) When they put you in that cell... And these bars are monitoring the house... So you know it's real... A lifetime exploded in the blink of an eye. There's nothing left but all the time in the world to think about it...
8. Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl (2003) When a teaser for this film debuted in theaters, we all had our doubts. How the hell can Disney turn a ride under splendour into a two-hour epic? Three words. Captain. Jack. Sparrow. Johnny Depp's role as a drunken captain, a smartass, and resourcefulness to defray without a ship made pirates instantly classic. With a well-rounded cast, beautiful sets, and a brilliant blend of comedy, action and drama, The Curse of the Black Pearl is all we love about Disney that rolled into action gems rare animals. Best quote: Captain Jack Sparrow I, I'm dishonest. And a dishonest man you can always count on to be dishonest. Honestly. It's the decent you want to watch out for. Because you can never predict when they're going to do something amazing... Stupid.
- Network (1976) What makes the network so large is that it is a universal realistic depiction of media in society. TV presenter Howard Beale (Peter Finch) gets tired of dealing with society's ailments so he goes on air and gives the most epic speech in cinematic history. His brute honesty makes him an instant icon, and inspires his career. The TV network is exploiting its resistance for profit. Bill's star power grows until he eventually jumps, and he has to be disposed of. The message online is becoming more and more important as our digital society progresses. Best quote: Bill I don't know what to do with the lows and inflation and the Russians and the street crime. All I know is that first you have to get mad. You gotta say, I'm a person! My life has value! so I want you all to get up now. I want you all to get out of your chairs. I want you to get up now and go to the window. Open it, and stick your head out, and yell, I'm mad as hell, and I'm not going to take it anymore!
6. Braveheart (1995) Braveheart is the best war movie ever made... Period. Mel Gibson directed and starred in this epic film depicting William Wallace's war (Gibson) for Scotland's freedom from English rule. The fights are brutal and graphic. The speeches are inspiring. The photography and soundtrack at Braveheart is so exciting, you'll find yourself really enjoying bagpipe music. By closing credits, you'll find yourself wanting to paint your face blue and shout FREEDOOOOO!!! Until your last breath. Best quote: Wallace yes, fight and you might die. Run and live... 5. Gandhi (1982) Richard Attenborough's three-hour biography of Mahatma Gandhi (Ben Kingsley) is the best biography ever made. Gandhi was a lawyer who liberated India from British rule. When William Wallace fought his heart, Gandhi fought violence with no violence and compassion, becoming one of the most prolific revolutionaries in human history. Covering as many highlights as possible from his life, the film showcases his wisdom of how anyone can follow suit. Best quote: Gandhi When I despair, I remember that the path of truth and love always prevailed. There may be tyrants and murderers, and for a while, they can seem invincible, but at the end of the day, they always fall. Think about it: always.
4. Cadillac (1980) Golf is by far the most boring sport to watch. Caddyshack, a golf-based comedy, is the funniest movie ever made.
